Local Projects:

- Our club provides a dictionary to each 3rd grader in Wayne County each fall including public, private, and home schools
- We provide one to five \$1,000 college scholarships to graduating high school seniors annually
- Our club volunteers to deliver Meals on Wheels each month
- Our club volunteers to ring the bell for the Salvation Army during the holidays
- We work with the United Way on various projects during the year
- We provide breakfast for the residents, their families, and the staff at Kitty Askins Hospice Center each April

International Projects:
